2. Official academic records from your university in Chile.
3. A curriculum vitae or résumé.
4. Three letters of recommendation from teachers or employers, or others familiar with your professional development.
5. Statement describing your professional objectives and a proposed plan for study at UW-Madison. Please outline how your proposed plan will contribute to your work or research. Please address how you foresee your work impacting Chile upon your return. This portion is a central part of the Neale Silva Memorial Scholarship. Please take time to reflect and document your detailed plan.
6. It is strongly recommended that applicants (especially those who have been working in their field or who are beginning a graduate program) identify and communicate with faculty members at UW-Madison to confirm or help shape their proposed plan. Including confirmation of this connection or support of your plan is advised.
7. Please include details regarding your previous international study and/or travel experiences.
8. UW-Madison requires strong English proficiency to attend our institution. You will need to provide your score from an English language test, and scores and tests will vary depending on the program you are applying to. If you are applying as a non-degree/special student, you can find the requirements [here](#). If you are applying to a graduate program, you can find the minimum requirements to apply to the Graduate School [here](#), but please note that some program requirements are different and vary by program.
9. If you are applying to graduate school at UW-Madison, please include your graduate school application (if your application is in progress) or acceptance forms. If you are applying as a non-degree student, you will be directed to complete the appropriate application form if your Neale Silva application is successful.
10. Neale Silva Scholarship recipients are expected to complete a project promoting the scholarship upon their return to Chile. Please include your proposed plan for this project including the target population, and how you will publicize the event/project.

Notes:

- 1) UW-Madison hopes to award two to four Neale-Silva Scholarships each year. Awardees will be notified approximately four to six weeks after the application deadline.
- 2) The intention of this scholarship is for Chileans to make connections in Madison (and to some extent in the state), so the scholarship does not support international (or out of state) internships or research even if they are a part of their degree program.
